

Challenges of Remote Care

- Remote geography, long distance, extreme weather, and limited infrastructure make healthcare delivery challenging.
- Access to specialist care requires innovative, culturally informed approaches.





Audiology Services – Hearing Australia Partnership

Hearing Australia conducts:

- 4 x Annual Adult Audiology Trips
- 4 x Joint Paediatric ENT Trips

They maintain records, communicate with NHS teams, and integrate care with local providers.



General Practitioner and Remote Area Nurse Screening

Ongoing screening by:

- Touring GPs
- Trained Remote Area Nurses

Clinics use video otoscopes to capture and send images for review or escalation.





Use of Telehealth

- Supports remote consultations and specialist input.
- Allows patients to stay
 on Country and be
 supported by trusted
 local clinicians.





Ear Surgery Blitz – Kalgoorlie Model

Twice yearly charter trips for 6 x children and their caregivers to Kalgoorlie. ENT surgery by Dr Francis Lannigan. Includes hospital stay and a positive town experience.
